

Queer Youth Assemble One Pager

NJ LGBTQ Youth State Commission (<u>A1592</u>):

- This bill creates a commission on lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and questioning youth within the NJ Department of Law and Safety
- The Commission will consist of 17 members with the following responsibilities:
 - develop and review recommendations for legislation, regulations, and policies pertaining to health and human services, housing, education, employment, business, and other areas which impact lgbtqia+ individuals
 - provide guidance to State agencies and departments to ensure anti-discriminatory employee hiring, retention, and promotion policies as well as forums for developing strategies and programs that expand the civic, social, educational, cultural, and economic status of lgbtqia+ individuals
 - serve as a liaison to federal, State, and local agencies to ensure that programs affecting lgbtqia+ individuals are effectively utilized and promoted
 - identify programs, scholarships, mentoring programs, sources of funding, and other resources for the benefit and advancement of lgbtqia+ individuals
- The governor will appoint the majority of the members (9)
- New Jersey would not be the only state with this type of commission
 - Massachusetts and Washington are the only states that have this LGBTQIA+ State Commission
 - Massachusetts is the only state whose commission is youth-centered
 - The Massachusetts Commission was founded in 1992
 - The commission releases yearly recommendations for state agencies about the ways various state agencies can directly improve the lives of lgbtq youth via direct and intersectional policy
