



## Queer Youth Assemble One Pager

### Trans Bill Of Rights ([HR269](#)):

- **This bill expands protections to trans and nonbinary communities under the 1964 Civil Rights Act with a new amendment**
- This bill includes a ban on conversion therapy and expands access to gender-affirming care.
- Requires the attorney general to designate a liaison to oversee enforcement of the newly-expanded civil rights
  - Invests in community service that prevents anti-transgender violence under the supervision of the Liaison
- **This bill would require an amendment to Federal education laws that would allow trans, intersex, and nonbinary students to do the following:**
  - participate in sports on teams and in programs that best align with their gender identity
  - use school facilities that best align with their gender identity
  - have their authentic identity respected in the classroom
  - have access to curriculum and books that accurately portray the substantive history and identity of LGBTQ+ people and Black, Indigenous, and people of color
- 68% of LGBTQIA+ students aged 15 to 24 stated they felt unsafe in school due to their sexual orientation, gender identity, and/or gender expression
  - Only 1/3 of students said that their school had an active GSA (gay student alliance)<sup>1</sup>
- There are an estimated 1.6 million Americans aged 13+ who identify as transgender
  - 1.3 million of those surveyed were adults, making this a national issue for all ages, not just the youth. <sup>2</sup>
